The Community Coalition Against Corruption (CCAC) is an alliance of organisations who have pledged themselves to mobilize and campaign on issues related to corruption that are of national interest.

This coalition was established in 2002 through the combined efforts of Transparency International PNG Inc (TIPNG), the PNG Media Council, Office of the Public Prosecutor, PNG Chamber of Commerce, Ombudsman Commission and the main line churches of PNG.

Over the years, CCAC has grown with the support of social action groups, faith based organisations, Non-Government Organisations and various others.

# our mission

The CCAC acts as a focal point for organisations to unite against issues of corruption

# our past

## 2002

CCAC was formed as an alliance of organisations declaring "War on Corruption".

## 2005

CCAC campaigned against two proposed bills affecting the leadership code and an increase of electorate grants. Clear public disapproval supported the CCAC and the bills were withdrawn.

## December 2006 to January 2007

From December to January, 25, 000 signatures were collected from CCAC members rallying to revoke amendments to the NCDC Act.

## 2010

CCAC rallied against changes to the Ombudsman Commission act; dubbed as the "Maladina Amendments". 20, 000 signatures were raised and a large scale protest march was organised to present the petitions to the members of Parliament. It was acknowledged as PNG's first ever peaceful large scale protest and resulted in the petition being received by the Leader of the Opposition and the bills being withdrawn.

## 2012

CCAC gathered support from the civil society and delivered petitions to Prime Minister O'Neill in opposition to the Judicial Conduct Bill and an attempt by Parliament to defer the 2012 National Elections. The Judicial Conduct Bill was repealed in February 2013.
